

### PRO SE CHANGE OF VENUE PACKET

### **Prepared by RMIAN**

This guide was compiled by the staff of Rocky Mountain Immigrant Advocacy Network and was written for immigrants detained in Colorado who are representing themselves pro se in their removal proceedings. This guide is not intended to provide legal advice or serve as a substitute for legal counsel. RMIAN is a nonprofit legal services organization and does not charge for its services. This guide can be shared and distributed widely to assist immigrants around the country.

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### How to File a Motion to Change Venue and How to Submit a Change of Address Form

### What is a Motion to Change Venue?

A *Motion to Change Venue* is a request to the immigration court to change your court hearing to a court closer to your place of residence.

### When do I have to submit a Motion to Change Venue?

You must file a *Motion to Change Venue* if:

- 1. You are transferred from one immigration detention center to another immigration detention center<sup>1</sup>;
- 2. You leave an immigration detention center<sup>2</sup>; or
- 3. You move to a new address in a different state/jurisdiction and you want to change your court hearing to the court that is nearest to where you are living.

In any of these instances, you must fill out and submit a *Motion to Change Venue*. It is very important that you file the *Motion to Change Venue* with the court, and that the court approves your request to move your case to a different court. If this does not happen, it is your responsibility to attend the hearings at the court where your case is currently located.

### For those Transferred to the Aurora GEO/ICE Facility from a Different Detention Center:

If you are transferred from another detention facility to GEO Aurora, you do not have to file a Motion to Change Venue; the Office of Chief Counsel usually does this. However, the case might be expedited if you, the respondent, files the Motion to Change Venue and the Change of Address Form. Once approved, your case-related mail will be sent to the Aurora Detention Center and your hearings will be scheduled at immigration court inside the detention facility.

### What are the steps to filling out a Motion to Change Venue?

- 1. Attached you will find a sample of a *Motion to Change Venue*. On this form, you should:
  - Fill in your name, address, registration number with the court (your "ID number"), and the place where you want your court hearing to be moved.
  - Include all information in English. If you do not write or understand English, look for someone who can help you translate and fill out this form.
  - Use only blue or black ink.
  - Sign and date the motion and include all pages.
- 2. Where it says "Proof of Service," you will put your name and the date, and also include the address of the government attorney's office. The government attorney's office is called the "Office of the Chief Counsel." You will find a list of their addresses in this packet.
- 3. With your signature you are swearing that you have sent a copy of the *Motion to Change Venue* to the government attorney's office and also to the immigration court.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> If you are transferred from another detention facility to GEO Aurora, you do not have to file a Motion to Change Venue; the Office of Chief Counsel usually does this. However, the case might be expedited if you, the respondent, files the motion.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> If you are released from the Aurora GEO/ICE facility, your removal proceedings remain pending, and you plan to live in either Colorado or Wyoming, you do not need to file a Motion to Change Venue. However, you will still need to file a change of address form with the immigration court.

What do I do if I change my address, but I'm still close to the immigration court I was assigned? If you change addresses but stay in the same city you won't have to submit a *Motion to Change Venue*, but you will need to send a *Change of Address Form* to the court no later than 5 days after moving. The *Change of Address* form is called the EOIR 33/IC. You can find the most recent version of this form at <u>https://www.justice.gov/eoir/form-eoir-33-eoir-immigration-court-listing</u>. Below you will find instructions that describe how to fill out and submit this form.

### What are the steps to filling out a Change of Address Form?

- 1. You may download the latest version of **Form E-33/IC, Change of Address Form** from the EOIR website at <u>https://www.justice.gov/eoir/form-eoir-33-eoir-immigration-court-listing.</u> Please refer to Appendix D for a sample. On the form, you should:
  - > Include your full name and registration number with the court (your "ID number").
  - List your old address on the left-hand side and your new address on the right-hand side. The new address is where you want the court to send you news of your appointments/hearings.
  - Sign where it says, "sign here," and include the date. Just like you did in the motion, where it says "Proof of Service," you should fill in the address of the government attorney's office, and include your signature.
  - Write everything in English. The court does not accept documents in Spanish or other languages unless they are translated.
  - ➢ Use only black or blue ink.
- 2. Where it says "Proof of Service," you will include your name, date, and address of the government attorney's office. You will find a list of the government's Office of Chief Counsel addresses in this packet.
- 3. With your signature, you are swearing that you sent a copy of the *Change of Address Form* to the government attorney's office and to the immigration court.

### How do I send the Motion to Change Venue and the Change of Address Form?

You must submit the two different documents to both the immigration court and the Office of Chief Counsel:

- Motion to Change Venue the motion asking the court to transfer your case to another court;
- EOIR-33 "Alien's Change of Address/Phone Number Form" the document notifying the immigration court that you have a new address

Once everything is filled out and complete, make three copies of the two forms. If you don't have a photocopier at home, you can go to Kinkos, Office Depot, Staples, or your local library. One copy will be for the immigration court, one for the Office of the Chief Counsel, and one for your records.

### The first copy will be sent to the immigration court:

In an envelope, include a copy of the **Motion to Change Venue** and the **Change of Address Form**. You will send that envelope to the immigration court where you currently have your hearings scheduled. You will put the address of the immigration court in the center of the envelope and your address on the upper left-hand corner (see sample below). Please refer to Appendix E to for a list of immigration court addresses.

You must send each of these documents to the immigration court where your hearing is currently scheduled to notify them that you changed your address and that you want to transfer your case to another court. If you only send the *Change of Address form*, the court will be able to reach you at your new address, but your hearings will remain in the court where your case is filed. Conversely, if you send the *Motion to Change Venue* but not the *Change of Address form*, your case may be moved to another court, but the news of the change will reach your previous address (where you are no longer living). If that happens, you may miss your court hearing since you will not be receive the notice. Remember that if you only change addresses within the same city, you don't have to file a motion to change venue.

If you want a copy as proof that you sent all required documents to the court, you will need to include the following in the envelope: an extra copy marked *"confirmed copy; return to sender,"* and an extra envelope with a postage stamp and your address. The court will send you back that copy with a stamp indicating that they received your request.

### The second copy will go to the Office of Chief Counsel:

In another envelope, include the second copy of the **Motion to Change Venue** and the **Change of Address Form**. You will send that envelope to the Office of Chief Counsel who is in charge of all immigration cases in the city where you currently live. You will put the address of the government representative in the center of the envelope and your address on the left-hand corner (see sample below). (You will find a list of the Office of Chief Counsel addresses in this package). (see sample below). Please refer to Appendix E to find a list of addresses for the Office of Chief Counsel.

### Keep a third copy of the Motion to Change Venue and the Change of Address Form for your records.

### What is the best way to send these two envelopes?

Take the two envelopes to the post office and buy enough postage to send them. We recommend you send the envelope that will go to the immigration court via "Certified Mail." If a piece of mail is certified, you will receive a receipt that serves as proof that you sent the documents. Please keep the receipt with your files.

### What should I do once I send the Motion to Change Venue and the Change of Address Form?

- 1. Wait for the immigration court to send you a new notice about your court hearing. If three weeks have passed and you have not heard anything with, you should call the court to find out if your motion was received and what the decision was. You can find a list of immigration courts here: <u>https://www.justice.gov/eoir/immigration-court-administrative-control-list</u> and on Appendix E.
- 2. You can call the *Immigration Court Automated Case Information System* at 1-800-898-7180 to check the status of your request. You will need to include your registration number (ID number). Then, if you click the number 1, you will learn when and where your next hearing is scheduled. Calling is a very easy way to make sure you don't miss your hearing.

3. Finally, it is not enough to send the *Motion to Change Venue* to the immigration court. <u>The court must approve</u> the transfer of your case to a different court. Until the court confirms the change of your court hearing (they will send a notice to your address), your case remains at the immigration court where it was originally scheduled, and it is your responsibility to attend. If you miss court, the immigration judge will order you deported from the United States. For this reason, it is very important that you monitor your case and attend all of your court hearings.

The information provided herein is not intended as legal advice, and it should not be construed as such. This information is provided to pro se individuals who seek to change the location of their immigration court hearings.

Instructions: To complete this form, fill out all blanks below, including the proof of service, which certifies that you have provided a copy of this form to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). After filling in the blanks and signing both the declaration and proof of service, you must submit the form in person or by mail. If submitting the form by mail, follow the mailing instructions on page two. You must submit a separate copy of this form for each individual in immigration court proceedings (i.e., you must submit a form for each person who has a case pending in immigration court and whom the change of address or phone number affects).

You must file this form with the immigration court within five working days of the change to your address or phone number, or your receipt of a charging document (e.g., a Notice to Appear) with incorrect contact information. The immigration court will send all official correspondence (e.g., date, time, and place of hearings) to the address you provide. The immigration court will only make any change(s) to your address and phone number in EOIR's records upon receipt of this form; the immigration court will not change your address or phone number based on a different address or phone number on pleadings, motions, or other communications with the court.

If you fail to appear at any hearing before an immigration judge when notice of that hearing or other official correspondence was served on you or sent to the address you provided, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) may take you into custody. In addition, the immigration court may conduct your hearing in your absence and enter an order of removal, deportation, or exclusion against you. If the court enters such an order, you may be ineligible for certain forms of relief from removal under the Immigration and Nationality Act as follows:

If you are in *removal* proceedings: You will be subject to an order of removal for a period of ten years after the date of entry of the final order. You may also become ineligible for voluntary departure, cancellation of removal, and adjustment of status or change of status.

If you are in *deportation* proceedings: You will be subject to an order of deportation for a period of five years after the date of the entry of the final order. You may also become ineligible for voluntary departure, suspension of deportation or voluntary departure, and adjustment of status or change of status.

If you are in *exclusion* proceedings: Your application for admission to the United States may be considered withdrawn.
